Dear Sir:

Reporting on survey for patent for J. D. McGregor, of surveys in Blocks 64, 65, 77, 79 and 81 Public School Lands, Culberson County, as per accompanying maps and field notes will state that I first examined all records of adjacent blocks available in both El Paso and Culberson County Surveyor's Offices and found that said Blocks 64 and 65 were called for by all surrounding blocks and therefore defined by course and distance. I found very few ties to natural or artificial objects, and of these I used the ties to Railroad on W. line of Sur. 7, Blk. 77, Public School and W. line of survey 7 Blk. 81 P. S. also, bearings from N. W. corner of Sur. 6, Blk. 81 P. S. to determine the direction of every line, said ties making Railroad bear N.  $84^{\circ} 58'$  E or  $5^{\circ} 02'$  from an east line.

The tie in W line of Sur. 7, Blk. 77, checked McCombs corner on said line 407 varas south of railroad which I found and this corner is referred to in all field notes of Blocks 64 and 65.

The tie to R. R. in W. line of Sur. 7, Blk. 81 also checked very closely monuments to the north as shown on plat and exactly bearings from N. W. corner of Survey 6, and south from R. R. exactly both as to course and distance rock monuments which I found at N. E. and N. W. corners of survey 1, Blk. 65, P. S. This tie at R. R. in W line of Sur. 7, Blk. 81 P. S. is the basis of survey of half sections in Blocks 79 and 81 P. S. as per field notes.

I set substantial monuments at convenient points and made frequent ties to natural and artificial objects as shown on map.

Kindly let me know at 515 Prospect Ave, El Paso, Texas as soon as possible if field notes are satisfactory, as part of my compensation, it is agreed, shall wait until you have indicated that same are satisfactory.
