9th day of July 1836. - Said survey commences
at the East corner, of a survey of $\frac{1}{3}$ league
of land, surveyed for Aron Burns, at a Red
oak tree standing 5 rods from the margin
of Sd. Clear Creek from which a Pine tree
11 inch in dia bears S. 62° E. 12 rods dist and
a Black oak 6 inch in dia bears S. 40° E
10 rods dist. and runs thence S. W. 17.06. rods
to stake; then South East 21.12. rods to stake
thence N. E. 86.4. to the East Branch of said
creek 18.84. to the main creek to a Black
oak 5 inch in dia on the margin of said
Clear Creek, from which a Black oak 7 inch
in dia bears S. 50° 2' E. 10 rods dist and another
or Black oak 6 inch in dia bears N. 15° W. 10.
rods dist, thence up S^d. Creek with the meanderings

Land Commissioners for the County of Harrisburg

Said Survey Commences at a pine tree 20 inches in dia
on the west side of Clear Creek where the lower lines of a League
of land granted to James F Ferry crosses said creek and from
which an oak tree 20 inches in dia bears S 69° E 15^m dist and
runes thence South west 5780^{ns} to bend of the creek & 3843 to a
stake at the edge of the prairie from which a post oak 12 inches
in dia bears North 25° E (magnetic) 45^m distant another post oak
12 inches in dia bears N 25° E 45^m thence S E 100^{ns} to branch of

Survey for A. Burns of one third of a League
of land, being the quantity to which he is entitled
by virtue, of a certificate No. 316. issued by the
board of land commissioners for the County of
Harrisburg. Said Survey commences at the last
corner of a third of a league recently surveyed
for William P. Harris as assignee of Jose de
La Garza at a cedar stake on the margin
of Clear Creek, from which a Red oak 12 in
dia bears N. 34° W. 8 rods distant, and an
other red oak 12 inch in dia bears S. 17° E. 10
rs. dist. and runs thence Southwest 60° 8. rs. to
a stake in the Prairie, then w. Southeast 54° W.
to bank of Clear Creek 14 1/4 rods to stake in the
Prairie there N. E. 20.000 to a Creek, 2060. rs.
to edge of timber 2600 along edge of timber
then leaves the timber, 4760. to timber in the
main creek and 5378. to Creek. Corner established
on a red oak 5 rs. dist. from the Creek,
from which a Pine 11 inch in dia bears S. 6° E.
12 rs. dist. and a Black oak 6 inch in dia
bears S. 40° E. 10 rs. dist. and runs then up
said creek, with the meandering thereof to the
place of beginning containing one third of
a league of land five labor's arable and
the balance pasture land. The bearing lines
are taken at the magnetic lines ^{true} at a vari-
ation of 10 1/2 E. to compass with the original
surveys. Present variation 9 1/2 E.

for being in the Battle of San Jacinto as appears
by a donation granted No. 191, dated May the 23rd
1838. said survey commences at the East corner, of
a survey recently made for William P. Harris
assignee of Horatio Brown's one of 640 acres on Clear
Creek and runs thence S. 77° 17' 10.8 varas to a stone
thence N. W. to a post oak 18 inch in dia from which
another post oak 12 inch in dia bears S. 18° E. 5 varas
dist - and a Pin Oak 10 inch in dia bears
N. 10° W. 10 varas dist. Thence N. E. along the East
line of a third of a League, of land surveyed
for Ann Burns 17' 10.8 varas to the South corner, of
the first mentioned 640 acres. Thence along the
South line, of the S. 640 acres 21' 12 varas to the
place of beginning, containing 640 acres of
land surveyed at a variation 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° East
to correspond with original surveys.
