


To the Commissioner
Genl Land Office

In regard to
the Williford Cartwright League
and the Geo Foley Survey, and
the surveys adjoining them on
the south, I can give only the
following explanation.

The Foley Survey, according to
reports made to me by two Deputy
Surveyors, conflicts with the Cart-
wright League 608 vs from East
to West, and the S.W. corner of the
Foley Survey is 330 vs $N 19^{\circ} W$ from
the South line of the Cartwright League
one of said deputies makes this East-
distance 329 vs. The S.W. corner of
the Foley is proved by its bearings
and by three marked lines running
from it, one line running $S 70^{\circ} E$
another $N 71^{\circ} E$ and the other $N 19^{\circ} W$.

The Willis West Survey calls for
the S.E. corner of League No 4 and
give the same calls for bearings
as league No 4. The West Survey then
calls to run $N 19^{\circ} W$ 590 vs to the
S.W. corner of the Foley Survey, and

gives the same bearings as the Foley Survey. Now to start from the S.E. corner of League No 4 & run to the S.W. corner of the Foley Survey, the course would be ~~S 80° W 69° N.~~

Taking the S.E. corner of League No 4 for the Beginning of the Willis West Survey and running out the calls of said West Survey and there is no other corner found: Beginning 590 vs S 198 from the S.W. corner of the Foley Survey and then running out the call of the said West Survey and all the other corners of the Survey are reached and the lines found plainly marked.
